Supreme NW Production of StarTrans Bus Line at Woodburn Facility

Supreme Industries, Inc., is a leading manufacturer of specialized commercial vehicles. On our site tour we were able to see their new line of shuttle buses on the production line. Supreme began **StarTrans shuttle bus production** at its Woodburn manufacturing plant in March.



Production at this site enables not only enhanced service to Supreme's U.S. bus customers, particularly west of the Rockies, but also significant freight-cost savings. Volume for the buses will range from 200 to 400 buses per year, depending on market demand.

Supreme is producing their curved-fiberglass shuttle buses, including the **Senator** and **Candidate** models, which are built on Ford and General Motors chassis. The buses are appropriate for hotels and retirement communities and can

also be used for transit services. They range from 20 -28 feet in length and can seat five to 25 passengers. Wheelchair lifts can also be added.

Supreme builds a wide variety of durable, high-quality bodies for work trucks, delivery vehicles and more. All Supreme bodies are customizable to meet the specific needs of the businesses or individuals who use them.

24th Annual Tulip Festival

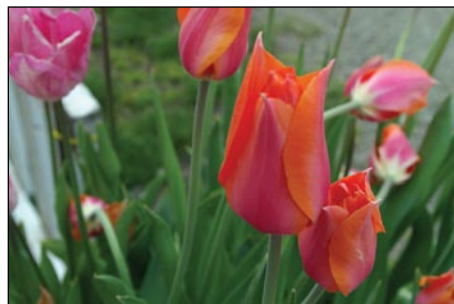
A First Hand Look Behind the Scenes and Tulip Fields in Bloom

It was a perfect day for a trip to the tulip fields with the flowers in perfect bloom and at their peak. The quantity and variety of the tulips in full bloom was amazing.

Our group went "behind the scenes" of the tulip farm, starting in the production area where workers were packaging the cut tulips for shipment. We were able to view bulb sorting and then a walk through the garden to the tulip fields.



Today there are over 80 acres of Tulips and Daffodils at Wooden Shoe. Their tulips are dug every year and from these, they hand select the top size and quality bulbs to send to their customers.



The fields are open for an entire month and Wooden Shoe has expanded their operation to include cut flowers, potted tulips, a gift shop, other plants, and all sorts of food and activities. The tram for touring the fields is also a big hit.



This year over 100,000 visitors attended the festival, one of Oregon's largest Spring events at Wooden Shoes this year. Thanks Barb!
